## Campaign to Protect Rural England, Somerset Minutes of Annual General Meeting. Held at Wells & Mendip Museum Friday 21st November 2025

The following Trustees were present: Hugh Williams, Chairman, Somerset CPRE, Vernon Hughes, Sarah Hutchison, David Julian, Jenny Raggett, John Roberts (also Honorary Treasurer), and Janette Ward. In addition, Simon Murray (Chair, CPRE), Becky Collier, (Branch Manager), Fletcher Robinson, (Planning Consultant) plus 30 CPRE Somerset members and 6 guests. The attendance list is held by the Branch Manager.

**Confirmation of the minutes** of the previous AGM – these had been circulated and were confirmed as a correct record.

## Matters Arising - none

**Review of the Year**: presented by Hugh Willams, Chair. Hugh gave a presentation showing highlights and achievements this year.

<u>Planning</u>: a busy year for planning – as always! Hugh ran through a snapshot of just the new cases in the last 6 months, including cases we had positively supported (rooftop solar installations and affordable homes for rent). Some battles won, some lost and many still working their way through the planning system. We are finding that expert advice is the only thing that cuts through but specialist legal advice or landscape and heritage reports don't come cheap. We have a small budget each year but also must rely on public donations and crowdfunding. We had an amazing response to our Frome crowdfunder – which allowed us to commission a legal letter and a landscape report, both used at the public inquiry in August.

<u>Events</u>: Our February Stargazing night in Middlezoy was very well-timed to coincide with the planetary parade and clear skies! We sponsored the landscape painting prize at Bruton Arts Society exhibition in August, and we held our second CPRE Countryside Day event in September at Shapwick Moor Nature Reserve, in partnership with the Hawk & Owl Trust.

<u>Litter project</u>: We have now given out over 350 litter picking kits to volunteers of all ages across Somerset (since 2020). We continue to work with SEND schools and Hugh gave examples of Penstone Farm, Cheddar and Cambian Lufton College, Yeovil, who take students out every week. Cambian students have been logging the most damaging items they find with the Marine Conservation Society Source to Sea national database.

<u>Fingerposts</u>: We have set aside £2000 of our budget each year to support Parish & Town Councils who want to restore their historic fingerposts. This year we have helped fund repairs in Crewkerne, North Curry, Greinton and Kingston St Mary. Others will be completed soon. In total, we have now helped to restore 38 fingerposts across Somerset.

He has also been our Company Secretary during that time. He has kept us on an even footing, has prepared numerous annual reports and accounts and done annual submissions to the Charity Commission and Companies House. John has offered to complete the accounts for 2025 before handing over to a new Treasurer, which is very helpful, so he will be staying on as a Trustee in the short term.

  person, but she is happy to make time for our charity and we look forward to working with her
  in our centenary year.

Stuart Watson, the adult winner was unable to attend but his £100 prize money has been sent to him. Olivia D'Ovidio, the under 19s winner, was present and Hugh awarded her a certificate and prize.

**2024 accounts:** The Treasurer, John Roberts presented his report. The accounts had been circulated to members. The reserves have continued at a stable level. Anyone interested in becoming our new Treasurer should contact Becky asap.

**Election of trustees**: Becky Collier, CPRE Somerset Manager, took the chair and reported nominations received for trustees. Nominations were for Hugh Williams, Vernon Hughes, Sarah Hutchison, Liz Parfitt, Bron Purkiss, John Roberts, Jenny Raggett, Fletcher Robinson and Janette Ward. These were proposed for election by Phil Holms and seconded by Mike Merrifield. On a show of hands all were appointed enbloc. Mariella Frostrup was proposed by David Julian, seconded by Janette Ward, and re-elected as President.

**Any other business & questions** – various questions were asked about inappropriate housing developments in our small villages, solar farms, and the Planning & Infrastructure Bill.

Hugh thanked everyone for attending. The meeting was then followed by a presentation by Simon Murray, Chair of CPRE, about CPRE's 100-year history, and a preview, by Becky Collier, of CPRE Somerset's centenary plans.
